School District Goals and Objectives

- 1. Students shall demonstrate skills that form the foundation for lifelong learning, such as critical thinking, problem solving, decision making, intellectual curiosity and artistic expression.
- 2. Students shall participate in the educational experiences needed to achieve the state and district standards or complete the requirements and goals as listed on a student's Individualized Educational Program (IEP), which may include modified standards.
- 3. Students shall demonstrate the social skills, academic knowledge and attitudes required to be productive citizens in a culturally diverse society.
- Students shall demonstrate job skills necessary to be effective, productive workers in the 21st century.
- 5. The district shall provide the best possible personnel, who are highy qualified as defined by the federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB), as well as the best qualified support staff.
- 6. The district shall ensure that staff, students and parents are provided the opportunity to participate in the development and evaluation of programs and policies.
- 7. The district shall ensure maximum efficiency in the use of district resources to meet the goals and objectives of the various programs and services.
